Dear Temple B'nai Abraham Community,

One of the starkest transitions in the Jewish calendar is between the final hours of Yom Kippur and the early preparation for Sukkot. At the end of Yom Kippur, we have been standing and praying with all our heart and soul for our personal and communal redemption. The Ne'ilah, or closing service on Yom Kippur, marks the completion of not only a 26-hour fast, but also 40 days of preparation that led up to the fast.

Exhausted and undernourished, we must immediately turn our attention to one of the happiest holidays of the Jewish year. "Z'man Simchatenu" or "time of Happiness," the Biblical name for Sukkot, is about recreating the journey of the Israelites through the wilderness, and imagining their first harvest of their newly found freedom. In many Jewish neighborhoods, the building of the Sukkah, or booth, begins as soon as one returns home from the break fast. The wonderful sounds of hammers and nails demonstrate a community excited to finally be able to start the New Year in earnest.

One of my favorite parts of this yearly ritual is the sense of freshness it can bring to our normal surroundings. While nothing in our homes may have changed a Sukkah brings out the best in what we already have. Most importantly, the building of a Sukkah encourages us to take chances with our surroundings, to not give into complacency. By accomplishing this relatively small project, we should have the confidence to experiment with something much more ambitious.

This summer, a large part of the B'nai Abraham community did just this. They set to work on a project to re-imagine what our synagogue building could look like. Under the leadership of the Temple board, led by Betsy Ramos and Eileen Gale, they forged ahead. This took intense planning and hours and hours of work. Unlike a Sukkah, which is only displayed one week per year, this is our home year round. After thirty years of no major renovation, it was time for a significant change.

I think that we can all agree that the final product is amazing. The space looks bigger and brighter, even the stained glass windows downstairs feel new. Suddenly, Hebrew School students have room to learn, our sanctuary is more prayerful, and the overall ambiance is warm and welcoming. A special thank you to Bonnie Friedman for her beautiful paint job both downstairs and up. As a congregant was overheard saying, it looks like a little slice of heaven in the sanctuary. My favorite new addition is the display case hand crafted by Victor Ramos, who did a majority of the heavy labor, and decorated with gifts by Shira Lowry. There you can buy children's prayer books, Mezuzot, and Menorahs.

On Sunday, October 15 at 12 PM, during Simchat Torah, the holiday where we celebrate the beginning of a new Torah cycle and the completion of the past year's cycle, we will dedicate the new look of our building. Please come and honor the hard work of all those who made this project possible.

As we say every Friday night during the evening service, "spread over us the shelter of your peace," a Sukkat Shalomecha.

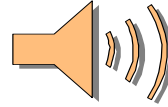

GUIDELINES FOR THE USE OF TEMPLE B'NAI ABRAHAM

(Please keep these guidelines and consult them if necessary)

SISTERHOOD MEETINGS AND SHABBAT SERVICES

Hostesses or host families set up and arrange the tables in the meeting room. The kitchen is usually stocked with sugar, tea bags, decaffeinated coffee, and paper products, however, check supplies and inform the Chair of House if supplies are low. Ingredients in cookies and crackers brought into the shul must be checked to be sure that only vegetable shortening is used and no meat is to be brought into the synagogue.

Although the temple is cleaned weekly, the meeting room and kitchen should be left neat and tidy after the function. All paper goods, utensils, and serving pieces must be returned to their appropriate drawers and cabinets. No leftover food should be left in the refrigerator – take it home. **ALL TRASH MUST BE REMOVED FROM THE BUILDING AND PUT INTO THE CONTAINERS AT THE SIDE OF THE BUILDING.**

Hostesses assigned to a particular meeting or host families assigned to a Shabbat service need to contact each other prior to the event to coordinate the duties. **If you are unable to serve on the date assigned to you, you are responsible for finding a substitute. Please inform the Sisterhood President that another person/family will take your place.**

Sisterhood reimburses Shabbat service expenses up to \$20.00. Members wishing to be reimbursed should submit bills to our Treasurer. Families celebrating special “simchas” have traditionally sponsored the Oneg Shabbat and have accepted full financial responsibility for it.

SPECIAL OCCASIONS: BAR OR BAT MITZVAH, WEDDINGS, NAMINGS, ETC.

The sponsoring family is responsible for the presentation and appearance of the refreshment table and the assembly room. Generally, the family has provided tablecloths and paper goods. In addition, you must supply your own wine and liquor. The kitchen and assembly room must be left clean and neat after the event and all trash removed from the building. If the temple requires special cleaning before your event, please contact the Chair of House.
