Dear Temple B'nai Abraham Community

Some of my fondest childhood memories are going to the movies with my Dad. We would see the all the big Hollywood hits, planning out when the next one was arriving at the SamEric on 17th and Chestnut and the Yeadon (two theaters that have long since gone out of business). The movies were the place where I learned about action and adventure, about hope and possibility. They were a place of imagination and escape. However, they were also the place where I learned a lot about my Jewish heritage. Whether it was The Ten Commandments or Exodus, movies enabled me to travel to places I had not, as of yet, visited on my own and explore the emotions that my ancestors must have gone through in their many plights in the wilderness.

As a Jewish educator, I have often used movies in my classes to open up important discussions on different Jewish topics. Two of my favorites are: Gentleman's Agreement, (1947) starring Gregory Peck, about a reporter who poses as a Jew to learn more about Anti-Semitism, and An American Tail, Steven Spielberg's cartoon depiction of his grandparents' arrival from Russia. I love the scene when Gregory Peck's character is not permitted to enter a hotel because of his Semitic sounding name, or Fievel the mouse's arrival at Ellis Island and the characters he meets there.

This month we are officially starting Movie Nights at Temple B'nai Abraham. Rick Shain, our adult education chair, has organized a wonderful opening night program on Motzei Shabbat, February 10 at 7:30 PM. There we will be showing a Jewish Argentinean film called "Lost Embrace" directed by Daniel Burman. Marcy Schwartz, whose specialty at Rutgers University is Latin American Literature and Culture, will provide insight into our discussion. Here is a description of the film from www.imdb.com:

"This is Ariel's world: the small, slightly seedy shopping center in downtown Buenos Aires, where the Italian shopkeepers scream all day, the Koreans sell feng-shui and old Osvaldo sells nothing. Where Ariel's mother runs a lingerie shop and his brother deals in import-export. It's a comfortable little world, in spite of an undercurrent of malaise and uncertainty. Many young people are searching for their immigrant roots to obtain a coveted foreign passport, the key to a world full of promise. Ariel, however, wants more than a passport from Poland, where his grandparents fled to escape the Holocaust. He wants to understand. Why his father left his family shortly after his birth to fight a war in Israel. Why he never returned. And why this seems to leave his mother and brother indifferent...But the truth changes. And when Ariel's father returns, he brings with him new truths, a new story and, ultimately, a long-overdue embrace--one that had been lost for so long."

Come eat popcorn and learn more about a Jewish world that is often forgotten!!
