Rabbi's Message

As many of you are aware, this year I began coursework for a PhD in Religion at Temple University. For the past month, I have been contemplating the multitude of intellectual passions that draw me toward deeper study, as I engage in the process of discerning which direction to follow for my dissertation. I am drawn, time and again, to the writings of Medieval Jewish rabbinic poets who wrote so extensively in discussion of our sacred texts but also expressed themselves through a creative medium. In their poetry, the mystical experience of the sacred is powerfully conveyed – an experience that may sometimes get buried in the midst of lengthy explications of a biblical text.

As we approach Tu B'Shevat, our New Year for Trees (which falls on February 8th this year), I would like to share a poem by a thirteenth century Jewish mystic, Yosef Gikatilla – “The Nut Garden” (as printed in Peter Cole’s *The Dream of the Poem: Hebrew Poetry from Muslim and Christian Spain 950-1492*).

The Nut Garden

The Nut Garden holds things felt and thought,
and feeling for thought is always a palace –

Sinai with flames of fire about it,
burning though never by fire devoured.

On all four sides surrounded so,
entrance is barred to pretenders forever.

For one who learns to be wise, however,
its doors are open toward the East:

he reaches out and takes a nut,
then cracks its shell, and eats....

Tu B'Shevat was celebrated by medieval kabbalists through a mystical seder that highlighted the spiritual qualities revealed by different kinds of fruits and nuts. The Nut Garden” was not written as part of such a seder, but his use of the nut as a metaphor for the numinous experience of the divine is in keeping with the mystical imagery associated with the holiday.

The inexperienced might not recognize the nourishment that lies within such a hard shell, or may prefer to find fare that is simpler to eat. Moses might have been deterred by the burning bush or by the fiery mountain. It can be challenging to see through the barriers that block us from the deepest core of sacred experience. But the poem suggests that reaching the sacred core may be as simple as eating a nut.

May we all experience such divine nourishment!

- 2) If you would like the Rabbi to officiate at the funeral, please ask the Funeral Director to contact the Rabbi when exploring possible dates and times.
- 3) There are many traditional Jewish practices that may offer guidance about the handling of the body, the funeral, and the burial. Please ask the Funeral Director to explore these options.
- 4) Resources about mourning, death, and dying are available from the Rabbi. There is also a synagogue document containing information about Jewish funeral procedures.

We hope this information will be needed as infrequently as possible!
