In between Passover and Shavuot we observe two special days of remembrance in the Jewish calendar. On Sunday, April 10th, is Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day. In our community, Yom HaShoah will be observed in a special service and program which will be held on Sunday, April 10th at 7:30 PM at the Abrams Hebrew Academy, 31 West College Avenue, Yardley.

Yom Ha'atzmaut, Israeli Independence Day is commemorated on the 5th of the Hebrew month Iyar, which falls on Monday, April 18th. We will observe the 35th anniversary of Israel's independence at our services on May 20th, 1983 which comes close to the English date of the creation of the State of Israel on May 15th, 1948.

I encourage the members of our congregation to participate in Yom HaShoah and Yom Ha'atzmaut observances which take place in our area. I look forward to seeing you on Friday and Saturday, April 8-9, 1983.
