Dear Temple B'nai Abraham Community

This February, I had the opportunity to take part in a program where a pair of comic strip artists presented. These were not just ordinary comic strip artists, but in fact a Jewish married couple, the wife a licensed social worker and the husband a longstanding cartoonist. Not only that, but they also happen to live in the community where I work in Elkins Park, PA, and are active members of one of the local synagogues (the husband is even on the synagogue board). And, to top it all off, the comic strip that they have created together, a nationally syndicated strip called "Edge City" (you can find it in the Philadelphia Inquire or at www.edgcitycomics.com), features the first identified Jewish family as its central characters.

During their presentation, the couple, Patty and Terry LaBan, spoke about their tentativeness when they initially brought Judaism into their comic strip. The idea first came into their heads in December of their first year writing "Edge City." Christmas had often been a theme in traditional comic strips, but what about Hanukkah? How cool would it be if their central characters, Len and Abby Ardin, lit a Menorah with their kids!! However, they were not ready yet to broach Judaism with a national audience. They chose instead to wait until the next major Jewish holiday, Passover.

Now, to decide on what part of Passover would be accessible to a largely non-Jewish audience. Well, they thought, most Americans have holiday meals with their families. What about a story line, where Abby's mother decides to pass on the hosting of their family Seder to the Ardins? Even if readers were unfamiliar with the specifics of the holiday, they could relate to the complications that this type of situation might cause. And, so the first official Jewish family of the funny pages was born.

The response was overwhelmingly positive, so much so that the next year, when they ran another Passover storyline, their editor suggested having the characters wear Kippot. The cover of their new book features the Ardins standing over a challah with the light of Shabbat candles flickering in the background.

The Ardin's Passover Seder adventure is something we can relate to at B'nai Abraham,. I take you back to last April, when the planning for our Passover Seder fell through and many of our members were left to fend for themselves elsewhere. Just as the Ardins' struggled with passing the torch down in their family, our synagogue struggled with finding new leadership to organize the Seder. This year, we are very fortunate to have Kim Aubry take on this very important task.

We are now scheduled for the second night of the Seder, April 3. If you are interested in helping out with this or would like to come to the Seder, please be in touch with Kim (kimaubry@gmail.com) as soon as you can. (See the details inside)

Other important March-April events include our very popular Purim Kids carnival and Megillah reading with Cantor Avi Green on Sunday, March 4, between 12 and 2 PM. All proceeds will go to Tzedukah. And, we have our second movie night on Thursday, March 8 at 7 PM at the United Methodist Church of Crosswicks. The film is "La Petite Jerusalem" which deals with Muslim and Jewish communities in a low-income Parisian neighborhood." (see inside for details).
