## Rabbi's Message

“Let's be honest- in some synagogues, guests are barely tolerated. The people in the constantly changing Bar and Bat Mitzvah crowd are viewed by many regulars as interlopers instead of as guests who are to be welcomed and valued. Changing this attitude toward guests is the first step in creating a welcoming ambiance in the congregation.

How can a synagogue love guests? The single most important way is for the congregation members themselves to express their personal welcome when they see a stranger.”

This quote comes from a book by Dr. Ron Wolfson called *The Spirituality of Welcoming: How to Transform Your Community into a Sacred Congregation*. Last year, I had a chance to meet Dr. Wolfson in person at a conference for Philadelphia area synagogues for which he was the key note speaker. There he, single handedly, welcomed all 250 attendees with a smile and a handshake.

As part of the conference, Dr. Wolfson led a session with the 40 or so rabbis in attendance. As part of that session, he took the rabbis outside to the front of the large Reform congregation where the conference was being held. He asked us all to imagine ourselves as newcomers to this synagogue. Would we know where the front entrance was? Would we be able to find the office? The rabbi's study? The sanctuary? Even, in this warm and welcoming environment, many of these questions were difficult to answer.

Amazingly, sometimes the hardest to find for a newcomer to a synagogue is the front door. Our synagogue is no exception, as several people have commented over the years, that

they did not know which door to enter from. At Germantown Jewish Centre, where Ashirah and I belong in Philadelphia, there are at least three entrances, none clearly marked or easy to figure out. And, once in B'nai Abraham, there is no easy way to find the bathrooms or, perhaps, even the sanctuary. What this proves to me, is that no matter how big or small, you can always be more welcoming.

I write these words on the eve of the most major event any synagogue holds every year, the High Holidays. This is a time where many members, who are not often there or are first timers, come to navigate the hardest service of the year. One could spend a lifetime studying the liturgy contained within the Machzor, the High Holiday prayer book. Aramaic, Hebrew, Major and Minor keys, references to all levels of Jewish writing, it is not easy, even for rabbis.

Therefore, it is imperative on people that do know what is happening and are familiar with our community, to help out those that are not as familiar. This may mean simply introducing yourself to a newcomer and making them feel at home. At a synagogue our size, we really cannot afford to turn away guests. Appreciate that people are new and might feel intimidated and alone, even amongst their family.

As we learn from our patriarch and matriarch Abraham and Sarah, let's keep our tents open from all sides and when guests come, greet them with our warmest welcome. This is, after all, the B'nai Abraham way.

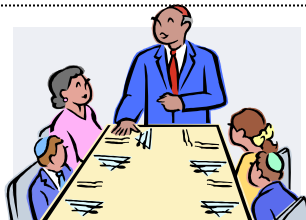

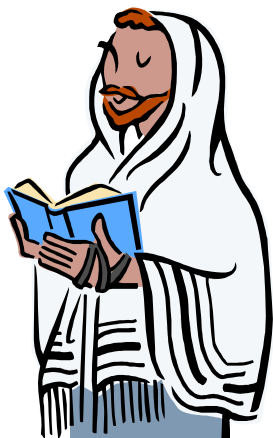

He motioned to a man (the one with the lotion), and said, "The only reason I have anything to eat, is because he shared what he had." And that man said the only reason he had food was that we had delivered it. So these two men (and whoever else) have been living on that bag of groceries for about a month. And the only reason they have something to eat is because you shared!!
